Kathryn J. Zerbe, MD, FAED, FABP is a Training and Supervising Analyst at the Oregon Psychoanalytic Institute and Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at Oregon Health and Science University. She has authored over 150 papers, chapters, and reviews and 4 books, including the landmark *The Body Betrayed: Women, E Florida Psychoanalytic Institute* and *Eating Disorders and Treatment and Beyond the Body Betrayed: Integrated Treatment of Eating Disorders*. Dr. Zerbe speaks nationally and internationally about eating disorders, somatic countertransference, psychodynamic issues across the lifespan, and the development of creativity in artists. She has won numerous awards for her teaching and writing contributions, including the National Eating Disorder Association’s Lifetime Achievement Award for her clinical, teaching, and writing contributions to the field.
